

Dear French.

I am writing to you on behalf of the Commanding Officer, officers and soldiers of Mentoring Task Force - 3 to express our gratitude to you for being part of our operations here in Afghanistan through the generous support you have provided to us.

Whilst you have not left home in Australia and physically come here to Uruzgan Province and worked alongside the men and women of the Task Force, your gills have helped to make all the difference to soldiers working in difficult and dangerous conditions for this nation of Afghanistan and for Australia; in effect, you have been with us.

I have probably worn out the keys on my computer's keyboard saying this in letters and emails, but the soldiers have consistently said to me that they have been overwhelmed with the gifts from Australia and they never knew so many people at home cared so much about them and what they are doing.
